
As a public school, these fees are necessary to help us offer the best possible education to your children.

The Final Exam Schedule

The *final exam schedule* has been distributed to all students on April 23rd, 2014. We have extra copies of it available at the main office. It is also available on the website of the school.

Please check the exam schedule carefully to ensure that you are aware of the dates of <u>all</u> your exams. Please note that the last day of regular classes is June 6th. Exams from May 21st to June 6th are done in <u>regular classes</u> and, for the most part, they are <u>on-going</u>. The starting date is given but it will end according to the student's timetable. Please note these exams are extremely important in

determining their academic success and in helping to decide their grade level placement for next year. Students presence is mandatory for all exams. Students who miss exams must have a doctor's certificate excusing their absences. An absence as a result of a family crisis may also be acceptable if supported with legal documentation. Students who have more than one exam scheduled at the same time are asked to complete an Exam Conflict form which is available at the front office. In these situations, the time of the exam will be adjusted. Good luck to each one of you in preparing and writing this year's final exams.

The presence at school for all students from now until the end of the year is crucial. Please make sure you advise the school at all time if your child will be missing school at extension 8132.

Field Trips in May

There will be a couple of field trips in the month of May. Your child should be bringing home a permission slip for you to sign. Stay tuned for the following:

Monday, May 5, JHS Science Department has organized a school trip to McGill University's Redpath Museum in the heart of Montreal. A guided tour enables the secondary 2 students to see first-hand such topics as animal biodiversity, dinosaurs, fossils, minerals, rocks, mummifications and more. It is a curriculum based outing and therefore, students must attend.

While in Montreal, the students will

also enjoy the experience of one of Montreal's favourite attractions, a walk from Beaver Lake to the Chalet on top of Mont Royal to capture a magnificent view of the entire city.

The cost for the bus and museum is \$10 per student and will require a bagged lunch and appropriate footwear and clothing. Students will be back in time for regular buses.
