## II. RELEVÉ DE NOTES

Students enrolled in **Cycle 2 – Year 2** (Secondary 4) and **Secondary Five** should receive via mail their individual *Relevé de notes* from the Ministry of Education between July 3 – July 6<sup>th</sup>. The *Relevé de notes* contains the *FINAL MARK* for Ministry Courses.

Please go over the *Relevé de notes* with your child immediately upon reception. If your child has failed a course, you are urged to consider sending your child to Summer School and/or writing August Exams. Failing a course(s) may effect their promotion to a higher grade level for the next school year, their subject placement and in some cases their ability to graduate from high school. (*See Summer School information below*.)


You can register online for August Exams from July 15 to July 24.

If necessary, Summer School is an excellent opportunity for students who are at risk of falling behind in certain subjects, or for students who have failed a course during the school year. Last year JHS students who attended Summer School had a 70% success rate. This confirms the effectiveness of Summer School.
