Once the home page has loaded, look at the navigation bar. The first step is to download their soft- $\ensuremath{\, \bullet \,}$ ware.

Click Get Skype and continue.

Select the version representing the operating system your computer employs.

Once the software's download has been completed, load it onto your computer by clicking the downloaded file, **SkypeSetup.exe**.

Within the loading process, you will be asked to fill out an application form and select a unique user name. Further to setting up, the program will test your audio and video in order to see if it is capable of running Skype. It will also ask if you wish to search for contacts. Whether you do or not is your choice.

Skype will work for 90% of the home computers on the Internet. It has also been tested within our school board and it does work without any communications port modification.


As your Skype user screen appears, you should be aware of a few points:

- You may add contacts by clicking **Contacts** along the Command Bar.
- To initiate a video call, your status must be "**On-Line**". Conversely, the party you wish to reach must also be "**On-Line**". On-line status is represented by a white check mark on a green field next to your user name.
- When everything has been set in order, click the green **Video Call** button. Remember video calls are free, phone calls are not.



At point of connection, your Skype screen should look somewhat like the one above, except that there will be two different people. You will always be able to see yourself in the bottom right corner while your sell

while your call partner will take up the rest of the screen. The



pop-up panel above will appear if someone is calling you.

A Note About Resolution


You may have noticed on the video call screenshot that one webcam seemed much clearer than the other.

The fault is not with Skype but rather the webcams. The superior screenshot comes from a relatively new computer with an equally new HD webcam;

an older computer and less powerful webcam.

Screen clarity is directly reliant on both the quality of the webcam and the bandwidth.

Group Video Calls



You may call up to 4 people at one time using Skype. To do this, look for

a button entitled Create a Group on your Skype screen at the bottom left.

Upon clicking, your right panel will change to reflect the above image. Click on the Plus Sign button.

A small panel will appear below the Plus Sign button. Select Add People to this Conversation.



Skype will then display your existing Contact List. Select those people you wish to add to your group. When fin-




ished, click the Add button at the bottom of the panel to continue.



After adding your contacts your new group. You'll returned to the Skype screen. Notice that the contacts you've selected are now dis-
