5.2 Budget Update

As emailed and explained to members.

- The unpaid school fees make it seem that the school operation budget is in deficit but it is not.
- In response to a comment from Vicki Fraser, anything the students are charged for that they do not receive during the year they are refunded for.
- Bathrooms will be renovated so although the capital budget has a large balance in it; it will be spent.
- In response to a question from Marie-Soleil Lecompte, even though the Sec. 3-4-5 are only in school 50% of the time, the supervision amount remains the same, because they still need the personnel in every day.
- The government measure money was explained to members. Looking at different ways to spend it all but due to COVID some of it may not be spent.
- In response to a question from Julie Courtemanche, the cultural outings could be used for teachers to attend a virtual tour or cultural activity online but they have to be on the list and it is a very specific list.
- Inspiring schools can be used for virtual field trips but right now there just is not the time to plan.

Student agendas

These have been a discussion for a while at TC and they are perhaps looking at the concept of not ordering them anymore as a lot of students do not use them. If agendas were ordered for all students it would be about 1300 but realistically only about 400 students or less actually want and use them. As they reduce the number ordered it becomes much more expensive. They are

considering asking students to pre-order them by April for next school year. The administration has checked with other schools outside of our board and they have stopped buying them and if students want one they buy their own. The members entered into discussion. If the decision is made to purchase agendas by choice, the students will not be penalized if they do not use them. The agenda is not consistently used by teachers and students, even in the younger grades. It was suggested to give students and parents the option of whether or not they purchase them but advising that they will likely be more expensive.
