| <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Building Improvements</u></p> <p>The bathrooms near the cafeteria were renovated at the beginning of this year. CO2 sensors have been installed in all classrooms. In addition to measuring the CO2 levels in classrooms, the sensors also make it possible to measure the temperature and relative humidity. The data that is collected will allow direct action to be taken and will provide a real-time portrait of these comfort parameters in order to quickly adjust if necessary. The library renovation project has begun.
