#### Exam Procedures & Information

The last regular school day for Laval Junior High School is Wednesday June 3rd. A LaRonde trip has been planned for June 5th, so we will be holding our last annual BBQ as Laval Junior on Thursday, June 4th. We will be serving hotdogs, veggie burgers, smoked meat sandwiches, chips, and water. There is no cost to students for the BBQ courtesy of PPO. Thank you to our hardworking PPO for their dedication and support.

#### Please note a few key points:

- There will be no regular classes during the exam period.
- All exams begin at 8:00 a.m.
- The buses will be running at the regular times on the exam days.
- Exam times vary but the latest any exam finishes is 10:30 am.
- Students are encouraged to leave the building when their exam is finished, to go home and study.
- Parents are encouraged to arrange transportation home. Students, who must stay in school, awaiting transportation at 2:10 p.m., must remain in Block C until dismissal.
- Please note that there is no cafeteria service during the June exam period. Students have to bring their own snack and/or lunch to school.
- DRESS CODE is compulsory for exams.
- Students will not be permitted to leave the exam room before 9:00 a.m.
- Attendance is a must! Students must be on time for their exams, and be prepared with pencil/eraser or pen/white-out, and any other supplies they may need. Bottled water is permitted in the exam room.
- No electronic devices are permitted during the exam. They are to be turned off and kept out of sight.
- In the event of an absence due to illness, students must provide a doctor's note and inform administration as soon as possible. For any other reason of absence, parents/guardians must contact the administration.
- REPORT CARDS Report cards will be sent by the 1st week of July, 2015.
- SCHOOL FEES: Please note that all unpaid fees were sent to collection.
- Please visit the school website for summer school information. If your child requires summer school, you will be notified by a phone call from the teacher.

#### AWESOME STUDY TIPS

#### GIVE YOURSELF TIME TO STUDY

Cramming doesn't work. It also doesn't give you time to ask questions on something you don't understand. Even if it's just 20 minutes per night. It's much less stressful to do a bit every night, then doing it all in one go.

#### SET UP A STUDY STATION

This is the place where you will always study. Make sure it's comfortable and you have no distractions.

#### MAKE YOUR OWN NOTES

Memory works on different levels. If you photocopy someone's notes you won't put things they way YOU understand them. When you copy out notes long-hand, there more chance that the information will stay in your head.

#### USE A STUDY BUDDY

Sometimes it helps if you take turns with someone to quiz you on information.

#### **EXAM WRITING TIPS**

WRITE YOUR NAME ON THE ANSWER SHEET You would be surprised how many people forget this crucial step.

READ THE <u>WHOLE</u> EXAM <u>BEFORE</u> YOU ANSWER

**ANY QUESTIONS** Take out the element of surprise. Is the answer to question 2 in a map on page 4? Maybe!


**PLAN YOUR ATTACK** Remember that you don't have to do the exam in the order it appears. Will the essay question take longer? Do it last!

#### DO THE EASY QUESTIONS FIRST

Answer all of the questions you know that you know first, and then go back to the ones you need to think about. You'll relax now that those are in the bag!

**TAKE YOUR TIME AND USE** <u>ALL OF IT</u> This isn't a race, and not using all of your time only hurts yourself. Check your work, catch any of those silly mistakes you see the second time around.

**NEVER LEAVE A BLANK** If you don't know the answer GUESS. A blank means no mark. A wrong answer might get you part marks.

## LJHS / Alberta Exchange Trip







This year, 24 Laval Junior High School students and 2 Laval Liberty High School students took part in a national exchange trip with Glendale Science and Technology School in Red Deer, Alberta. This amazing opportunity was subsidized and supported by SEVEC and the Department of Canadian Heritage.

LJHS hosted the Alberta group for one week in April. During this time, students and teachers from both groups spent two days at Arundel Nature and Science Centre, explored Old Montreal and Chinatown, visitied Mont Tremblant, took part in a Ghost Walk Tour of Montreal, climbed Mount Royal and spent an evening at iSaute.

The LJHS group then flew to Alberta on May 2 for one full week of exciting activities. The students hiked through the Badlands near Drumheller, visited the Royal Tyrell Museum, toured a coal mine, took part in Science Olympics at the school, hiked in the Rocky Mountains, visited West Edmonton Mall, rode the Jasper Skytram, had a snowball fight at the Columbia Icefields and explored the Edmonton Telus Science Centre.

More than exciting activities, the exchange trip allowed 50 students from two very different parts of Canada to bond and learn about each other's communities. Strong friendships were made that will last far beyond the actual trip.
