Laval Liberty is pleased to congratulate our Sec 5 students who participated in this year's Fermat Math Competition. The results are in and our students ranked in 3rd place out of all 50 participating private & public schools in Quebec. The only 2 schools above ours at this level were College Laval & Bishops College School in Sherbrooke.

In addition, LLHS ranked 1st place in the 'zone competition' made up of 17 Quebec high schools. Other schools in this zone include West Island College in DDO, E. S. Felix-Leclerc, Lindsay Place H.S., St. Thomas H.S. all in Pointe-Claire, Philemon Wright H.S. in Gatineau, Laurenhill Academy in Saint-Laurent, Lester B. Pearson H.S. in Montreal-Nord, Pierrefond Comprehensive in Pierrefond, Macdonald H.S. in Sainte-Anne-de-Belleview, and Beaconsfield H.S. in Beaconfield. We have now earned the title of **Zone Team Champions**!!!(see attached)

Leadership Day Trip to Ottawa

Advanced Student Leaders put together their year-end trip. They were in charge of coordinating all of the details as a shared learning experience. Through process elimination, they decided to go to Ottawa on April 15th for the first time this year. They spent time with some of Canada's top leaders and visited historically significant sites. It was a memorable trip full of significant moments.

Additional highlights:

- At Rideau Hall the students gained the attention of the Governor General's staff. Their quiet time of reflection on the grounds was noticed; It created waves in the form of emails sent across the country of their presence on the grounds to members of our Advanced Student Leadership family in BC, Alberta and Ontario about what they were doing.
- When the Leaders walked into the Canadian War Museum, the retired men's chorus 'Aged in Harmony' was waiting for them. They sang 'Has Anyone Seen the Colonel', shook the student's hands and gave them a camp mini flag. The troop came in only for the students and only to sing them a song... it was a very appreciated continuation of a deep cross generation connection.
- LCol. P. Dawe Sr. spent the day fellowshipping with the students imparting leadership knowledge and sharing his time with us; LCol. John Errington came with us to Beechwood Cemetery, Rideau Hall, Parliament and Lansdowne Park; and General P. Dawe met with the group after their visit to Parliament grounds and joined them on their visit to Lansdowne.









Music Concentration Performance

On April 16th, the LLHS Concert Band was invited to perform for a group of senior citizens celebrating the 50th anniversary of Laval at the Young Israel of Chomedey Synagogue. The band performed a selection of music representing varied repertoire they had learnt throughout the year, from popular film tunes to music originally composed for concert band that they had presented at the MusicFest Quebec Music Festival in March where judges awarded them a Silver Standard. 

Student Assemblies

On April 22, 2015, Laval Liberty Secondary IV and V students attended an assembly on the commemoration of the centenary of the Armenian and Pontian Greek genocides perpetrated by the Ottoman Turks during which 1.5 million Armenians and 353 000 Pontians perished. The event was organized by Ms. Gosdanian with the help of Ms. Tzotzis and a group of dedicated students. Adam Leal, Richard Habib & Alyssa Camide presented the historical background of the Ottoman Empire's Pan-Turanian policy which led to the persecution and systematic elimination of its Armenian, Pontian and Assyrian minorities. They reported on documents gathered by historians and shared letters written by the American ambassador to Turkey, Henry Morgenthau. Eleni Parigoris, Michael Koutouzis , and Pagona Karastogiannis presented excerpts from witness accounts of the atrocities committed towards the Pontians. Dikran Missirian and Badrouyk Chamlian shared the stories of their great-grandparents who had survived the Armenian Genocide. Thun Carl meticulously worked on all aspects of the audiovisual elements of the presentation. The occasion was a solemn one and made the students reflect on the grand-scale consequences of intolerance and hate.

Final Exams

Please note that in some classes, final exams began as early as May 5th. Attendance is mandatory and must be punctual.
