- **Mother Teresa Chapel:** joint efforts between Ms. Chronopolous and Mr. Mason have taken place in regards to conserving the status of the chapel. A directors meeting is taking place this coming Monday and discussions will take place along with Jerome Dion. This project is being looked at with the hope that every effort will be made to respect and keep intact the integrity of the chapel. Results of the meeting will be shared with G.B. members as to long term plan for this project.
- **Garbage:** the accumulation of garbage near the soccer field (fence) has been looked at and addressed since the last G.B. meeting, with positive results.

• Cafeteria: since the last meeting where the issue of the cafeteria lines and overcrowding was brought up. The lines seem to have decreased as well as wait time; in fact it was observed that between 12:15 and 12:40 the cafeteria is empty. Perhaps because of ECA that were introduced during lunchtime the students seem to disperse and not be in line as much. However, at the general assembly a reminder will be communicated to the students that access to the cafeteria is available during the duration of lunchtime, that all three stations are open, not to bunch up and clog the line with friends etc. this information will help encourage the students to use the cafeteria fully and make the most of their lunchtime.

6.1 Chairpersons Report:

Mary Cataldo would like to acknowledge the Green Club that has worked all summer growing produce and the addition of a table and tree was also possible thanks to the Green Club. She would also like to acknowledge and thank those involved for supporting this initiative and giving of their time.

6.2 Principal's Report:

• SWLSB has just signed to promote and house new health center in Laval for Vocational Adult Education that will be offered to international students. This initiative and decision takes place at the school board level. This program will be housed at the Daniel Johnson building. With the budgetary cuts at the government level this is a positive long term plan to generate income for SWLSB and in turn help the schools. However, the logistics of how the space is going to be utilized has not been finalized although discussions have started. The program will be offered in the evening and on the week-end. The building was selected based on the existing unused space available and would be able to accommodate the program on first and second floor. Ms. Chronopolous suggests to the G.B. members to refer the council minutes available on the school board website for more information. Any and all new information will be brought back and shared with the G.B.

Policies/Programs

• CPR: Update

Our CPR training on September 19th went very well, and was much appreciated by all staff. This initiative is aligned with our ABAV plan to make sure all students are safe within our building. As a follow-up, we will be purchasing an extra defibrillator so that we have one located at the main office on the second floor and one will remain on the first floor, in the Phys. Ed. department.

Our school is offering different social groups that all students from our school are able to take part in. These same programs are the same ones set up last November and will continue to be offered this year.

Pedagogy:

• E.L.I (Engaged Learning Initiative Project)

Our select group of teachers from the Math, English and FSL departments has received training to share with their colleagues in the means to help students be engaged in their learning within a differentiated, inclusive environment. Following the initiative training

session, a few more teachers were sent to a second workshop last week to be part of a Professional Learning Community involving all schools within our school board. Students will be benefitting from chrome books, manipulatives and books/novels from ESD as well as in-house training from Ms. Lynn Senecal, Coordinator from the Inclusive Schools Network (ISN)-QESB

• IPL C: Creative Minds Upcoming Projects

Our students have come up with an inclusive name this year to define them as learners: Creative Minds. The team will be working closely with ESD this year. Their approach will be more project-based learning opportunities. They will be receiving 10 new iPads to help support their learning through new applications that will provided by the school.

• Phase II Programs 2014-2015

possibilities for programs in Phase II of the Laval Schools. Human Resources will also be part of our discussions along with our teachers from both schools in the next coming weeks. Our focus: To meet the requests of our community and students and provide for a Junior School that will be set apart from the private sector. We want our students to remain in our board and meet their needs as learners, artists and athletes.

• First Communication: October 15th 2014

Our first communication will be sent home with our students on October 15th. Parents are asked to review the Evaluations of Learning Document sent out prior to our Curriculum Night so that they are informed on the grading system, dates report cards will be sent home, and opportunities to meet with teachers on Parent-Teacher nights.

• Special Needs: IEPs Update

All parents have received information on IEPs through our August 20th Transition Day for new students. All MTJHS teachers have also received information through articulation meetings by our professionals/administration on students who have special needs before the school year started. We are the only high school piloting the new MEQ IEP format as of this year, training all teachers and professionals on its use. This new format allows for input from parents and students directly online. It also allows for an easier way to collect data and make it better representative of all classes a student may be receiving support in. Our IEP day is scheduled on October 10th, and will be followed by scheduled meetings with all parents who are interested in reviewing the final draft. All IEPs will be finalized and sent home on November 26th, the day our first-term report cards are issued.
