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Special pedagogical projects, extracurricular activities and optional courses help students stay in school and succeed. More then ever, it is important for us to keep working together to help stop the spread of the virus and provide young people with conditions to help them thrive.

 The new guidelines are based on the progressive regional alert and intervention system established by the public health authorities to ensure that young people can stay motivated, adopt and maintain healthy life habits, discover new passions, and much more. The groups must be the same each week, but it may be possible to change the groups after the December break, as the students will not have been in contact with each other for 14 days. Priority must be given to optional courses that are prerequisites for college-level programs; these courses can be offered in person or through distance learning.

SAFETY FIRST

Recommendations:

- · Prioritize activities held outside, if possible.
- · Limit the sharing of equipment (sports equipment and other equipment).
- Clean and disinfect the equipment used as well as practice and training rooms (including the floor) after each group has used them. See the specific information for swimming pools.
- For team sports played within a group, ensure the players on the field and the players on the bench rotate.
- If possible, have the coach, teacher or group leader use a voice amplifier device to ensure physical distancing is observed. Physical markings showing the distance to be maintained can also be installed on the floor or walls.
- Disinfect shared stationary equipment after being used by different groups.
- · Avoid physical contact that is not necessary for the activity.

Requirements:

- Ensure that players and support staff (coaches, medical teams, etc.) complete a questionnaire about the presence of symptoms before each match or practice.
- Ensure that the number of support staff members (teachers, monitors, coaches, medical team, etc.) is limited and that they remain the same throughout the school year.
- Wear the personal protective equipment that is appropriate for the risk involved when staff members are required to be less than 2 metres away from another person without a physical barrier. (This equipment must include a medical mask and protective eyewear, either safety glasses or a visor that covers the face to the chin.)

A student cannot participate:

- If they are showing symptoms of COVID-19:
 - return to school or daycare.

A new normal

Students participating in special pedagogical projects or extracurricular activities must follow the same guidelines that apply at school:

- Wearing a face covering
- Frequent handwashing
- Respiratory hygiene
