# 7.1 PC Chairperson

## 7.2 School Board

### 7.2.1 General Directorate

- The education minister announced on March 31 that they will double the budget for the tutoring measure. This will give an additional 10 M\$ for SBs and SSCs SWLSB: \$ 133,390.
- The Ministry of Education has authorized 42 groups of 4-year old Kindergarten for 2021-2022. This year, in 2020-2021, we have 34 groups.
- Presentations of results of the C02 testing at governing board meetings has begun. Analysis of results and corrective measures
  are taking place. Schools with more questions on this should submit their questions and will get responses from the head office
  soon.
- The new SWLSB website was launched on March 31.
- A new leadership program was launched in partnership with L'Institut de leadership and Services Québec Laval. Registrations are open – Starting date: May 11<sup>th</sup>
- The Hydro-Québec Montreal Regional Science & Technology Fair was done virtually this past weekend. There were many winners from LSA. One student will move onto the provincials. LSA will be hosting the fair in 2022.
- A billboard for AEVT was put upon Curé Labelle going towards 440 exit Cleroux in Laval. It was installed on Monday, March 8.
   The campaign is for 4 weeks.
- A week-long advertising campaign played on Virgin Radio to recruit students into the Institutional and Home Care Assistance program. A new 9-month program begins April 12.
- The Hopefest/Laurier Gala Facebook Live event will take place on Friday, May 28, 2021 7:30 p.m.
- CNESST has a new directive where all employees must wear a procedure masks at all times while in their workplace. These
  new directives are not meant for students, only for the staff.
- The SWLSB Chairperson wants to recognize all our stakeholders who come together every day to keep our schools safe.
- In response to a comment from Hillcrest Academy, the ADG replied that it is nice to hear positive observations from members. There are many wonderful things happening in our schools.
- Several media reports occurred during the month of March. SWLSB had some good recognition.
