Ils peuvent comprendre un texte d'une longueur maximale de 1500 caractères pour les candidats. Une photographie du candidat, ainsi que les coordonnées auxquelles les électeurs peuvent joindre le candidat peuvent également être fournies.

Il incombe au candidat de s'assurer de la conformité à la loi du texte fourni, de la qualité de la langue et de l'exactitude des renseignements fournis.

Le président d'élection ne doit pas modifier le texte fourni, sauf pour en réduire la longueur en deçà de la limite permise. Les erreurs d'orthographe, de grammaire, de syntaxe ou de frappe ne sont pas corrigées. Le président d'élection n'a pas à vérifier l'exactitude des renseignements fournis par le candidat.

## Cautionary note

Information aimed at keeping electors fully informed is provided by candidates in keeping with the guidelines determined by the Chief Electoral Officer of Québec and are distributed to electors in a document published by the returning officer of the school board. It can include a text of up to 1500 characters for candidate. A photograph of the candidate as well as the address and telephone number where electors can reach them may also be provided.

The candidate is responsible for ensuring that the text provided complies with the law, that it is well written and that the information provided is accurate.

The returning officer must not modify the text provided, except to reduce its length below the permitted limit. Errors in spelling, grammar, syntax or typographical errors are not corrected. The returning officer does not have to check the accuracy of information provided by candidates.
