



Highlights of the New School


- School capacity of 384 students

- 1 common learning room(library/multi-purpose)
- 2 sensory rooms
- Daycare services
- 1 synthetic playfield
- Double gymnasium with partition divider
- Drop off zone for busses and parents
- An emergency generator

Criteria for establishing school zone for new school


- Distance from different sectors to new school in Saint-Lin-Laurentides or to an existing one
- Travelling time
- Number of bus transfers
- Natural geographical boundaries
- Division by cities

Franklin Hill and Pinewood School Zones


A review of the school zones for Franklin Hill and Pinewood allows us to establish a sustainable plan to address:


- The important demographic growth in Lanaudière-Sud region

- Space available at Franklin Hill Elementary


A New school:


- Allows us to optimize student enrolment in adjacent schools
- The opportunity to give students access to a modern design infrastructure

Important note | To address the situation with the students located in the 'Boot', allowing them to attend a school within proximity of their home, the sector of La Plaine needs to be rezoned to the school in Saint-Lin-Laurentides, and reduce overcrowding at Pinewood.

Advantages of Reviewing Franklin Hill Elementary School Zone

L'Assomption & L'Épiphanie

- Proximity school for the community
- Transportation availability for current OOZ students
- Reduced travelling time

Saint-Sulpice

- Transportation availability for current OOZ students
- All students already going to FHES

Lavaltrie (South-West)

- Access to larger school facilities
- Same travelling time as for JES



Advantages of Reviewing the Pinewood Elementary School Zone

- Alleviate the overcrowding situation
- Allow students to attend the school which is closest in proximity.
- Reduce travelling time for students.
