

The CTSP:

- Responds to the community's need
- Is implemented in cooperation with all stakeholders
- Promotes partnership among the various levels of the education system (MEQ, school board and school/centre)
- Is the roadmap to develop the school and centre's Educational Project








How are we doing?

What we are doing well

- High graduation and qualification rate
- Student enrolment on the rise surpassing ministry projections
- K4 classrooms in majority of our schools
- Bilingual education (high success rates in Ministry French and ELA exams)
- School Climate team to support schools/centres and provide training
- Task force to address inclusion, diversity and equity across the school board
- Launched a Truth and Reconciliation initiative to increase Indigenous cultural awareness in our schools/centres
- Established network of LEAD teachers to drive innovation in Educational Technology
- Mentorship program for teachers and new administrators
- Sport-Études program in Laval (Only English high schools north of Montreal to offer this)

What priorities must we <u>ABSOLUTELY</u> consider and include in the next CTSP?



Top priorities

Development of mental health and wellness initiatives/programs for students and staff

Pedagogical and social emotional support for diversified learners within an inclusive setting.

Promotion of life skills training in and outside the classroom.

(time/ stress/money management, communication skills, growth mindset, etc.)

Integration of deep level learning skills within pedagogical practice

(critical thinking, digital literacy, media literacy, eco-awareness, etc.)

Access to immersion program in all schools to equip students for success within Quebec's francophone culture and society


