These words could not be truer as the rights of the English citizens of Québec to be educated in English have been recognized with the exciting decision of the Quebec Court of Appeal to uphold the Quebec English School Boards Association's (QESBA) case against Bill 40. The concern now is that the Québec government may decide to appeal this decision to the Supreme Court.

- Parent Commissioner Chloée Alary pointed out that March 8, 2025, was International Women's Day and that, while it was not a school board event, the arena in Lachute was rented so that women could come together and skate while celebrating the strength of friendship, equality, empowerment, and inclusivity;
- Commissioner Bob Pellerin noted the following activities in his region:
  - April 5, 2025, he attended the Pasta Night Fundraiser at Franklin Hill Elementary School;
  - April 11, 2025, he attended the Joliette High School Talent Show which was well received and provided great entertainment;
  - April 26, 2025, he attended the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Rawdon Elementary School construction combined with a fundraiser for the revitalization of the school playground;
  - Joliette High School participated in a book reading competition and made it to the finals;
- Commissioner Donna Anber noted that the intelligence of the students who participated in the NextGen Assembly left her speechless. She also noted the wonderful Sainte-Agathe Academy Talent Show and the Arundel Elementary School's first ever Theatre Club Show.

She extended a big thank you to the Ville de Sainte-Adèle for responding so quickly to a road security issue at Sainte-Adèle Elementary School. The Ville de Sainte-Adèle is putting a pilot project into place for the safety and security of the students and neighbouring stakeholders.

#### 5.0 Report from the Director General

The Director General presented his monthly report noting the following:

- Visits to schools and centres: Forty-two visits have been completed to date;
- Attended the following meetings: English school boards, Management, Parents' Committee, Forum des DG, special meeting of the English-Language Vocational Education Council (ELVEC), General Assembly of the ADGSQ;

- Enrolment for the 2025-2026 school year is being closely monitored and, as of April 29, 2025, 12,611 students are registered. When reviewing the numbers at this time for 2024-2025, there are 70 fewer students registered. However, since registration continues through the spring and summer, it is anticipated that these numbers will increase;
- A targeted registration campaign using census information was implemented for the first time and there has been an increase of 50 students spread over four schools that were targeted. Census information will be used again for future registration campaigns. A special thank you to the Legal, Corporate and Communications team for their efforts in making this a success;
- The Career Planning Questionnaire was recently sent out to all management personnel to see if any might be interested in a change. A meeting will be held with those who request one. Meetings to discuss career planning have not been held in several years;
- In order to bring stability, the school board is pleased that it has been able to reduce the number of interim in-school administrators from 15 to one interim principal and four interim vice-principals, one special project, one replacement, and two vacancies. In May, recruitment to fill the two vacant vice-principal positions will begin. This will bring the number of interim positions down to three;
- A recruitment session will take place on May 7, 2025, for anyone who may be thinking about taking on a leadership role as a principal or vice-principal;
- On May 12, 2025, the formal inauguration of Heritage Elementary School will take place, and the Ministre de l'Éducation, Bernard Drainville, will be present;
- The Laurier Gala and Star Fest will take place on May 29, 2025;
- Upcoming Vocational Training Programs include the Comprehensive Review | OIIAQ Exam on May 31 and June 7, 2025, and Stationary Engine Mechanics, which will begin on September 1, 2025.

Parent Commissioner Tara Anderson reminded everyone that the May 8, 2025, Parents' Committee meeting will begin at 7:30 p.m. and will be online only.
